# Rivermont Golf Club Executive Board February 08, 2016 Meeting Minutes

The meeting commenced at 6:30pm with an introduction and welcome from Jerry. Committee members then introduced themselves to the group including their years at Rivermont (which will be included below in brackets [].

## **Discussions**

## Anthony Wright (Turfcare) [9 months]:

Building on Mark Hoban's turfcare report, Anthony addressed a few topics:

- Green firmness: The greens will continue to become firmer until the July 18-21 aerification, where they'll soften up for a while before firming up in late August/early September. The bermudagrass greens will show fewer ballmarks in general.
- July aerification: The course will be closed for 4 days (7/18-21). Turfcare will aerify the
  greens Monday to get them playable as soon as possible. The fairways and tee boxes will
  follow Tuesday-Thursday. The large bore aerification will only happen once/year and is
  needed to remove organic matter and allow air and nutrients to reach the root system.
  Needle-tining will occur other times of year to vent the greens.
- Green grain: Verticutting & brushing techniques will be used to reduce the introduction of grain.
- Fairway worms/worm castings: aerification this summer will help reduce castings, but much of
  the problem is the large amount of rain which forces the worms up. When organic matter is
  removed, the worms will go deeper, unless, of course, they're getting drowned by too much
  rain. The chemical that kills grubs also kills worms, but intentionally killing worms is
  prohibited. Also note, the worms in the worm farm are not the same type as on the course.
  Our worm population indicates very fertile soil, which is good! This also saves money on
  fertilizer
- Will be putting new holes in for RMGA February event. Replacing some other hole locations due to some fraying.
- Hoping for green growth to begin in March
- There was been some leaf spot and Pythium root rot in December due to the extreme amounts of rain. The leaf spot has largely cleared. There is still some Pythium still on 13, 14 & 16. Testing of root plugs showed 4-5 inches of root and the plants come back under grow lights.

## Chelsea Colclough (HOA) [2 years]:

Chelsea is the new Treasurer for the Rivermont Community Association (RCA), and will be the ongoing representative.

The rivermontliving.com website is being reviewed to see if they get the community to utilize it more.

Jerry talked about the strong partnership between RGC and RCA and emphasized that he'd like to see more communication regarding what RGC does for RCA while acknowledging RCA providing space in the monthly publication for Chris to engage with homeowners. RGC also hosts the RCA homeowners meetings (though not for this February due to clubhouse renovations). RCA is happy to publicize relevant RGC committee announcements.

There are 914+ homes in Rivermont, the largest community in Johns Creek.

The HOA is happy to include inserts into welcome baskets from any groups.

# Matthew Evans (Pro Shop) [15 years]:

Building on his Pro Shop report:

- Northstar POS system will not have people booking their own online tee times.
- GPS drifting is due to several areas on the course not being able to triangulate. When carts can only "see" one or two satellites, there can be a 15-30 yard difference in where the cart thinks it is and its actual location. At the moment, no known fix. [Editor's note: can or does Visage utillize differential GPS where there's a fixed reference, for example, on top of the clubhouse?] Maps are set to be more lenient in the less accurate areas.
- GPS yardage accuracy is very good, except in these areas.
- GA PGA event, 3<sup>rd</sup> year. Chateau Ste. Michelle is the sponsor this year and next. No Pro-Am Sunday due to Mother's Day and the tournament itself will be one-day, 36 holes on May 9<sup>th</sup>.
- Rivermont was re-rated by the GSGA last September/October. New scorecards will be here soon. Scores posted online are already correct with the new rating/slope numbers.

# Dana Weeks (RWGA) [9 years]:

- Opening Brunch on 3/10
- First playday is 3/17
- Expansion of Game of the Week (allowing members to play the week's game any day from Friday through Thursday) is helping to increase membership, possibly as many as 10 more members

## Belinda Marsh (Handicaps) [35 years]:

- 2016 is a major revision year for rules of golf and handicapping
- Contentious new rule is not being able to post if playing alone
- Some handicapping rules have changed regard what's an acceptable score per hole: more to come on how this will impact the club and players
- USGA rule bans anchoring, long putters may still be used
- Committee members for Handicapping:
  - RMGA Kyle Wood
  - RWGA Barb Edstrom
  - RSMGA Will Wood
  - 9-holers no representative/reviews, just trying to learn the game
- Chris said that the club will make a concerted effort to explain Handicap committee to the membership over the next few months
- Individual associations are the watchdogs for their members they should bring issues to the Club Handicap Committee. Provides uniformity and takes pressure off of the individuals within the associations.

## Chris Cupit (GM) [44 years]:

Built off of the February newsletter:

 Club narrowing its focus to do the most important things very well and provide a private golf club experience that is second to none. Policies and decisions should support the Core Mission:

Allowing people to come together and play golf on a well-conditioned, good golf course and then enjoy their fellowship afterwards in a nice, relaxed environment, but maintaining a truly private air about the club.

- Excited about changes on and off the course including technology, appearance, course changes
- Dredging will increase capacity of the irrigation pond by 2-4 million gallons (currently 3.5m capacity)
- Cart path will go up the right side on #7, may add a fairway bunker under the irrigation box. Need water to drain down toward creek, so fairway will slope, but widen by 8'. White tees will

be a little longer and reds will gain an area farther back as an additional distance option.

- Forward tees on #6 will look more like true tee box and aim golfers at the green
- Pond will have some more shape to it at the green side
- Shade concerns remain on holes 9, 13 & 17.
- Mark is going to enjoy his new bushhog
- Intent regarding future tree removal is to keep up with chipping trying to clean up #6 tree graveyard
- Interior work:
  - o Begins 2/15
  - Updated flooring for landing, steps, most green carpet, all brown carpet
  - Reupholster chairs
  - [Editor's query: ceiling tiles??]
- Front entrance and lighting also to be redone
- Focus Groups almost finished. A walker's focus group is coming up. Chris Nowack has been running the discussions great feedback so far.
- Looking at additional membership tiers for seniors, as noted in the <u>newsletter</u>. Priority will be to seniors moving up to 6-day at reduced rate. One option would be reduced rate for Monday-Thursday; second option a reduced rate full membership, prioritizing upgrades vs. downgrades.
- Topics brought up by other attendees and addressed by Chris:
  - Billboard advertising at Barnwell/Holcomb Bridge has gone well. A couple of inquiries, one new member. No negative feedback. Ads will run January, February & April
  - Range mats will probably be replaced in the Fall
  - Walkers: Not looking to discourage walking, but do want to insure that walkers walk the whole way. 1/3 of those playing on Saturday were walkers (44/135, 10 of those were half & half). Looking at maybe 4-baggers for the carts but there are some storage concerns.
